#### STRONG START

The first three weeks of the year have flown! It has been wonderful to welcome all the students back, looking very smart in their uniforms. For the first two weeks, the learning programs in every class focus on a "Strong Start". This is a time when teachers and students build their new class communities and develop common norms for getting along together in their new, shared spaces. All classes explored what it means to be a Mathematician and practised sharing their reasoning - how they solved - their maths work. In English during Strong Start, teachers screened students for their phonological knowledge (the sounds in words) and phonic knowledge (letter and sound relationships). The Junior Primary teachers used the Initialit program to screen students. A new spelling screener was used in Years 3 to 6.

Our Year 1 to 6s have been fantastic role models to the new receptions - showing them how to join in with regulating strategies at Huddle and supporting them with learning about "Be kind, be respectful be responsible and try your best." These are our four behaviour expectations for safety and learning.

Acquaintance Night was more formal this year with each teacher sharing information with parents in a short presentation. The Leadership team and Specialist subject teachers visited each class and introduced themselves. It was great to see so many families in attendance. There will be another opportunity for teachers and students to share learning at the Term 3 Learning Showcase. Parents are encouraged to make a time to meet with class teachers at any time of any term to discuss their child's learning progress. Families will be able to visit the Specialist learning spaces as part of the Term 3 Learning Showcase.

On behalf of all the staff at Goolwa Primary, I'd like to share that we feel very privileged to be able to teach and learn with your children and we are looking forward to a fantastic year ahead.

Welcome back to GOSHC for 2023! We have started off term 1 well with many returning students and some new faces joining us for the first time. Our new receptions are settling in well with a designated GOSHC Educator ensuring these students are supported in the transition from the school day to before and after school care each day. We are continuing to focus on child led activities which encourages the students to initiate activities which the educators support. Some positive outcomes include baking and cooking, gardening, dress-ups and craft activities. Educators offer a range of toys and equipment and support the students to engage in activities they enjoy. We work closely with the school staff to ensure the students are supported and feel safe and comfortable in a play led environment. Our bookings are filling up fast and we have already been at capacity some nights so make sure you book in early to ensure your place. Our GOSHC Educators are; Tracey Price (Director), Hope Meffle, Ruth Jurevicious and Jasmyn Evans.

"I think you should come to GOSHC, it would be the best. Last year we played games, went outside and on the playground. I also do some gardening and planting. We do drawing and tracing, we sometimes play the Wii if we want, dress up in costumes, and find and decorate rocks. At GOSHC we like to be creative and play together. 

# All types of School Card applications **are now online.**

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below

STEP 1	Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard
STEP 2	Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.
STEP 3	Complete all mandatory fields. Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.
STEP 4	Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
STEP 5	Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button. Please note: If you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.
	save the form, and return to complete it at another time, g on the 'SAVE' button.

Families who are not on school card are eligible for a government rebate of \$100 per student. An updated statement showing the balance will be sent home later this week.

## **STUDENT SERVICES OFFICE**

Our new Student Services Office is open!! After lots of construction and interruptions, it is now up and running and working extremely well. The Student Services Office operates out of the old "Bookroom" in the Administration Building next to the Netball Court. All payments, notes, student enquiries etc will go straight to this area to be processed. Visitors and contractors to the school will still go to the Reception area in the Administration building.

# **LUNCH ORDERS**

All lunch orders need to be placed via an online program called **QKR**. Goods to Go provide and deliver the food and drinks. Orders and payment are both processed via this app, so there is no need for brown paper bags or finding coins in the morning! Families can order lunch up to 2 weeks in advance. Orders close by 9.15am on the day of delivery. If you do not wish use the app, we can place orders for you via Student Services. This will incur a \$1 administration fee. If it is a once-off emergency lunch order, this admin fee will be waived. Please be sure to include an extra \$1 to the cost of the lunch order if you wish us to do the ordering for you.



**QKR** is a free app and is provided by the Commonwealth Bank and is simple to download. Once downloaded, set up a profile for your child/ren and choose your payment option. You can pay for uniforms, school fees, OSHC fees and lunch via the app. If you have any problems downloading QKR, please contact the front office on 8555 2261. Remember to update your child's profile for their new class / room number this year!
