UNIFORMS

Uniforms can be purchased online via the QKR app at any time, and will be delivered to your child/ren the next day. If the Uniforms Shop is unattended during the above hours, please present to the front office.

STUDENT SERVICES OFFICE

Our new Student Services Office is open!! After lots of construction and interruptions, it is now up and running and working extremely well. The Student Services Office operates out of the old "Bookroom" in the Administration Building next to the Netball Court. All payments, notes, student enquiries etc will go straight to this area to be processed. Visitors and contractors to the school will still go to the Reception area in the Administration building.

LUNCH ORDERS

All lunch orders need to be placed via an online program called QKR. Goods to Go provide and deliver the food and drinks. Orders and payment are both processed via this app, so there is no need for brown paper bags or finding coins in the morning! Families can order lunch up to 2 weeks in advance. Orders close by 9.15am on the day of delivery. If you do not wish use the app, we can place orders for you via Student Services. This will incur a \$1 administration fee. If it is a once-off emergency lunch order, this admin fee will be waived. Please be sure to include an extra \$1 to the cost of the lunch order if you wish us to do the ordering for you.



QKR is a free app and is provided by the Commonwealth Bank and is simple to download. Once downloaded, set up a profile for your child/ren and choose your payment option. You can pay for uniforms, school fees, OSHC fees and lunch via the app. If you have any problems downloading QKR, please contact the front office on 8555 2261. Remember to update your child's profile for their new class / room number this year!

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

School card applications are encouraged to be submitted by Thursday 31st March.

Families who are not eligible for school card are eligible for a government rebate of \$100 per student. An updated statement showing the balance will be sent home next week so you are up to date.

ROAD FOOTPATH SAFETY

A reminder for all parents and caregivers that you must not pick up or drop off students whilst driving and stopping in the middle of the road, or whilst stopping at the crossing on Cadell Street or Gardiner Street. The speed limit is 25km through these crossings. We appreciate your support with this so that we can continue to keep all students, families, pedestrians and motorists safe during these busy pick up and drop off times. As the bus now arrives earlier in the afternoon, please DO NOT park in the bus zone at the front of the school.

You may see some lines on the public footpath at the front of the school. There are 2 yellow lines near the bike rack and another set of yellow lines in front of the double storey building. The footpath between these two lines is strictly a 'walk your bike' area.





NO DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

SWIMMING


